## **Writing Your Own Poetry**

After several weeks of studying poems by various authors, we are now going to begin writing our own poems!

Instructions: In a Google Doc you will write three different poems. I have listed the requirements for each and a rubric for each below. Please read these carefully!

1. A poem that focuses on rhyme scheme For this poem, you must write three stanzas that have a consistent rhyme. Each stanza must be a minimum of four lines long. You may choose any rhyme scheme you would like and may write about anything you would like. 2. A poem that focuses on figurative language For this poem, you must write three stanzas that each contain a figurative language device. These may contain the same figurative language device or it may change from stanza to stanza, but must be apparent in each.
